Dr David Petts from the Department of Archaeology will showcase his recent widely acclaimed research. David is an Associate Professor in the Archaeology of Northern England and convenes the



Department's North-East England Research Group. His main research interests focus on the social archaeology of the 1st millennium AD, with a particular focus on the development of Christianity. As part of this he is carrying out fieldwork on the Holy Island on the site of the Anglo-Saxon monastery of Lindisfarne. His lecture on the 28th October at 18:30 will be followed by a wine reception and dinner.

At the time of writing the Book Group are working to get another author visit for November and we are finalising a walk from the Priory to the Cathedral by Keith Taylor. Charlotte is busy with a programme of social events. If you are able to lead a walk (including a pub visit) during the Epiphany Term, in the local area, then please could you let Vicky Brown know as soon as possible. We will circulate you all by email when we have further details of these events but keep your eyes on the website.

It is hoped the long awaited Prowse Room make-over will start this term. Phase 1 will be to update the furnishing and TV to try and make the room more welcoming. As pressure comes on for the use of all meeting rooms in College it would be great to see more use being made of the Prowse Room.

Please note if you are a college mentor to tell your students about the new SCR Arts Scholarships. SCR Secretary Deputy Treasurer



Principal's Report

The very short summer vacation ended in September with a thump. Term had already started with again, upwards of 450 Freshers joining the Van Mildert Community, about one-third from overseas and most engaging in over 80 different clubs, committees and societies that the student body has to offer. Each evening, most College rooms are filled with all manner of activities from Dance and Music to sport (e.g. badminton and cheer), and from Dec Soc to the Knitting Soc! Staff from the Principal's Office have already met with the six outreach projects and the Director of Outreach; and there is already a deep reservoir of enthusiasm, experience and expertise.

Induction was an exhausting carousel of briefings and talks by our own staff, our colleagues in the Fire Service and the Police, and a massive menue of JCR, and to a lesser extent MCR, events. Matriculation in the Cathedral was a colourful and lively occasion and Mildert's own pride Formal, suitably labelled the *Sic Vos Non Vobis* formal was hugely enjoyable. Huge credit to our outstanding Frep Team; they were superb.

I can report a couple of staff changes. Liz Ryder (formerly our Sabbatical Development Officer) has been appointed, after a competitive assessment and interview process, as our first ever Student Experience Officer. Liz will be primarily involved with our student development and enrichment programmes (notably Mildert Dimensions) together with Alumni Relations but will have time to help with other tasks. Restructuring in the catering and operations areas has provided challenges but we have been extremely fortunate to have been assigned Katie Dowson (Community Operations Manager) and Guy Morton (Food and Beverages Manageer) as part of the Van Mildert community. I hope you will welcome all three to their new and exciting roles in Colleges. Within our scholarly community, we are delighted to welcome Dr Sean McMahon who has already presented his IAS Lecture, 'How to find fossils in Mars' to a packed Ustinov Room.

The SCR has already a packed programme for the Michaelmas Term, with the ever-popular book club, dinners and lectures, the SCR mid-week buffet lunch together with walks and an outing to the Oriental Museum. Members are especially welcome to the 10th Annual Van Mildert College Trust Lecture by Dr Richard Lane OBE on Friday 15 November. Richard's theme is particularly relevant to Mildert and its environmental agenda, '*World Health - their problem is our problem*'.

As you may well be aware, in February 2019, the JCR voted overwhelmingly to withdraw from the Durham Student Organisation Framework, which was set up in 2011 and has since overseen the Common Rooms financially and administratively. Independence means that the JCR will have to reorganise itself as a charity under the Charities Act 2011, and therefore we need to recruit a Board of Trustees. We are currently welcoming applications from SCR members for positions on the Junior Common Room's first Board of Trustees. I have been inspired by the continued collaboration of students and staff, and their shared love and ambition for Van Mildert College.
